



Criteria for accessible venues

Accessible Venues Checklist: What does the venue offer?

Is there clear signage nearby / outside of the venue identifying the building?			
Is the venue identifiable on a local map?			
Is the venue on public transport routes?			
Does public transport run at regular intervals to the venue?			
Is the venue in a well-lit locality?			
Is the venue away from narrow streets and alleyways?			
Arriving at, and entrance to, the venue			
Is there accessible parking area(s) allocated for the venue?			
Is there space to park bikes?			
If there are steps at the entrance, is there also a ramp?			
Does the building have automatic doors?			
Inside the building			
Is there a contactable duty caretaker / manager / receptionist?			
Does the venue have an ambience which is welcoming to diverse communities?			
Does the venue promote diversity in the material it displays?			
If there are lifts are they fully accessible?			
Is there a lift which is able to			

accommodate mobility scooters / reclining wheelchairs?			
Does the building have automatic doors throughout?

Can wheelchairs be manoeuvred unimpeded throughout the venue?			
Are there signs throughout the venue that can be understood by all?			
Is there an Induction loop system?			
Is there a public announcement system?			
Are roving microphones available?			
Can door handles be easily operated?			
Are there low level light switches?			
Are electric sockets at heights which can be used by all adults?			
Are fire alarms audible and visible?			
Toilet and kitchen areas			
Are there accessible toilets?			
Are accessible toilets easily located?			
Are there alarms systems in toilets?			
Can taps in kitchen and toilet areas be easily operated?			
Are floors in kitchen and toilet areas non- slip?
